Hello Everyone!! First of all, I would like to welcome you to the new school year. While we do not have any new external changes this year, like a new football field and track, we do have a new internal change; and that is a new school administrative software system called PowerSchool. Unfortunately, Sasi and ParentConnect, the programs we have been using for years are being replaced by PowerSchool. While many of the functions are the same, there are also some major differences, so there is a lot of programming information involved with the change. We started the implementation process in May; unfortunately, we have hit several obstacles, so we look to have the program running smoothly by August 21. What this computer change means to you is that your current ParentConnect log-in information is no longer valid. So, as soon as the new program is fully operable, we will email your log-in information or

mail it if we do not have your email address. If for some reason you misplace your password or login name, you can call Mrs. Epperly in the front office, and she will give it to you. We are very excited about the parent side of the new program as the teacher gradebook has some new features including notification if homework is turned in, personal notes, and up-to-date grades on the student's home screen. Of course, the program is as good as those who use it, and you have my commitment to monitoring the gradebooks with the goal of all teachers keeping their grades as accurate as possible. On a final note, while many of us were trained on the new system, it will take time for us to become proficient with the program and its navigational tools as well as training the other teachers. only during your assigned date and time; however, siblings may purchase their books all at the same time. Every effort has been made to accurately fill textbook orders based on your student's schedule and the textbook form you submitted by June 5. If a form was not submitted to the bookstore, it was assumed that your student had no books and a complete order was put together for him or her. Payment may be made by check, cash, VISA, or MasterCard.

VERY IMPORTANT! EACH student must present a completed and

signed emergency card by parents or legal guardian in order to purchase books. A student will not be admitted into the bookstore without their emergency card or if the card is missing information or signatures. It is also permissible for another family to pay for and pick up another student's books; however, they, too, must have the completed and signed emergency card for that family.

Textbook Return Policy—Textbooks may be returned to the bookstore for a refund by **Friday, August 28**. A receipt is required for all returns or exchanges.

We'll be telling the seniors this in September, and we'd like parents to reinforce it. Please let your counselor check over your application for college admission before you submit it. The Cal State and UC applications ask students to list courses and grades for grades 9

through 11 and proposed courses for grade 12. We want to be certain that you list all the required courses. Just save and print the application and let us review the paper copy before you submit it to the university.

Fall College Tour—The application packets for the fall college tour for seniors will be available in the lobby of the counselors' offices on or about the seniors' first day of school. We are planning to visit the University of California in San Diego, San Diego State University, the University of San Diego, UCLA, USC, and one other university in the L.A. area still to be arranged. The tour will leave school after lunch on Thursday, October 1, and return on Saturday, October 3, in the evening. As of this writing in mid-July, we
