TOP STORY: St. Joseph New School Rules

Dear Knights, some changes have been recently made to the St. Joseph High School handbook. The changes done are about school rules and reinforcements on these rules. People may already know of these changes and have their thoughts and opinions on them. But, for people unaware of these new school changes, this article may help understand what they are.

One of the biggest changes concerns the dress code rules. For starters, only polos from Dennis Uniform are permitted for students to wear daily. In the past, students could buy polos from other websites like Nike, but this is no longer permitted at St. Joseph High School. Next, Mass days are a whole different story as students can only wear one of six approved sweaters on mass over the Dennis polos. Another change in the student dress code is that joggers were allowed last year as long as they weren't made up of athletic material, but this year, joggers of any kind are forbidden on campus!

This brings us to the issue of ordering from outside vendors and having them delivered to the school. According to the [Shield](#) under the Secure Gate Policy, *“Any other persons will not be permitted to enter unless on a daily list, or the front office gives the staff member at the gate permission for them to enter. Parents dropping off lunches, sporting gear, etc., will not be granted access to campus. A table will be set up outside of the gate for these deliveries. Any vehicle/driver dropping off a student after 8:10 a.m. will not be permitted to enter campus. Drivers will check in with the staff member at the gate, and the student will exit the vehicle and proceed to the office to check-in. Please note: Delivery drivers will not be permitted to enter campus, nor will students be allowed to contact a driver or other person outside (or through) the gates. Deliveries will not be accepted, and drivers will be sent away.”*

Moreover, there are specific violations that will now cost students money for violating them. The first of which is that going into the parking lot during school hours would cost \$10, as going into the parking lot is no longer permitted under any circumstance! Again, according to the [Shield](#), *“Parking on the St. Joseph campus is a privilege,”* moreover, *“Students are not permitted to access their vehicles during the school day for any reason. 1st offense: \$10 fine. Note: Repeated violations will result in escalated discipline.”* So, regardless of your reasons or things left behind in the car, you will need to leave them there until after school. Another broken change in policy concerns shaving or not being shaven before coming to school. The [Shield](#) states plainly, *“Male students who are not clean-shaven will be required to shave at school before returning to class and are subject to dress code violation sanctions. 1st offense: \$5 fee to be paid in the front office. Phone/iPad will be held until the fee is paid. Continued noncompliance will result in progressive discipline.”* But the big one is weekend detention. Yes, you read right! We now have ‘Weekend Detention’ of which, as written in the [Shield](#), *“Students are expected to serve any assigned hours of detention the next day detention is held. Each failure to attend detention will result in an additional hour being added. Failure to serve detention may result in Saturday Detention (or other arrangement) for which a \$50 fee will be assessed to the parent.”*

Note: Plenty more rules will cost students money that is not mentioned here, so go to the Shield and look them up! But don’t get too upset, as there is a reason why these rules were implemented and it just might have something to do with an uptick in violations of many of these school rules. However, this is a balancing act as it's easy to fall into what is known as ‘Reactance.’ As written by [Kayla Armstead of Study.com](#), wrote, *“Reactance theory can be observed in nearly everyone's lives when limitations are placed on people. People naturally want to break free of them, regardless of if the choice to do so is logical. Jack Brehm, an American psychologist, developed the theory of reactance to explain this phenomenon. In simple terms, reactance theory states that when people's actions and choices are restricted, they need to resist to gain their freedom. Jack Brehm first introduced this theory in 1966 and later expanded on it, focusing on freedoms and how people make choices based on the feeling that their freedom is threatened.”*

Traumatizing Storms Hit the US!

The weather in Maui, Hawaii, one of the strongest in history, conspired to create conditions leading to a deadly firestorm. Winds blowing up to 80 mph spread a deadly wildfire that burned Lahaina, the original Capital City of Hawaii. Lahaina was one of Maui's most decorated and famous cities, known for its iconic front street, shops, and restaurants. The fire was so fierce and strong many survivors had to jump into the ocean. As of August 8, 2023, a little more than a month

ago, 115 have been reported dead and over 1,000 missing. The fire destroyed over 3000 homes and many more buildings that were famous shops and restaurants. The fire caused up to \$6 billion in damages and will take years to rebuild. The iconic city of Lahaina will never be the same, as Maui is devastated by the damages and loss of life. Another major weather event that greatly affected Western North America was Hurricane Hilary. The hurricane devastated Mexico, and it hit the U.S. hard. At least one person died from the storm in Mexico. Southern California got hit by record-breaking rainfall, reportedly receiving a year's worth of rain in one day. Roads flooded, rock slides crushing cars, and mudslides buried everything with mud. The National Hurricane Center issued its first-ever tropical storm watch.

As the hurricane landed over the northern Baja California Peninsula in Mexico, it steadily weakened the closer it traveled into south-central California, which for the western US dogged a bullet. The last reported Hurricane that came to California was named Nora in 1997.

For instance, Elephants are the world's largest land animal. According to the National Geographic, elephants get up to around (2.5 to 4 meters) from shoulder to toe or 8.2 to 13 feet. They generally weigh (2,268 to 6,350 kilograms), or 5,000 to 14,000 lbs. The next interesting fact about elephants is their tusks. To the naked eye, one may assume that the elephant's tusks are horns, but they are actually two large, overgrown teeth. In addition, the way that elephants communicate is different from most animals. SCIENCE: JAMES WEBB: Our Eye in The Sky

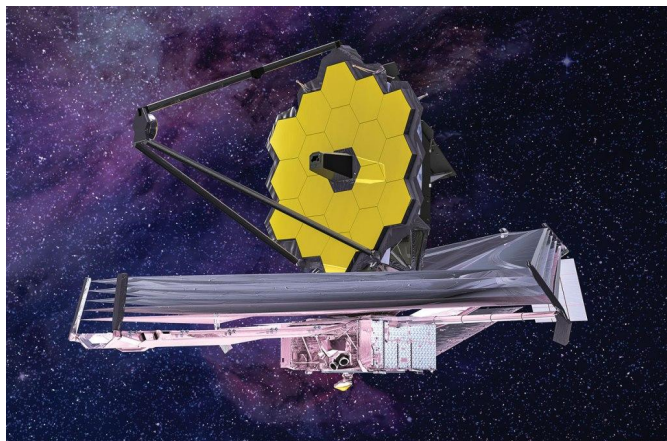

Everyone has heard of the Hubble Space Telescope. Everyone knows it takes pictures of very faraway objects, and many have seen some of its pictures. Everyone knows the Hubble Space Telescope has expanded our understanding of the universe. But what about the James Webb Space Telescope? It's far newer, has the same goal, and has taken pictures of much greater quality.

To find out how popular it really is, I decided to interview some people to see if they knew about it. My first question was simple, “*Have you heard of the James Webb Telescope?*” 40% of respondents said yes, and the other 60% did not.

My second question did not reflect similar results, though. I asked each respondent if they thought they knew what it does, and 80% of them answered Yes. My final question boasted more immaculate results. When asked if they had seen any images taken by the telescope, all of them answered yes.

The James Webb Space Telescope is named after a former NASA administrator of the same name. The telescope is a collaboration between NASA, The ESA (The European Space Agency), and The Canadian Space Agency. According to NASA, its mission is to “Compliment and extend the discoveries of the Hubble Space Telescope.” It will let us continue to see the spectacular objects and phenomena that exist far beyond Earth. The duration of the mission is expected to last approximately five to ten years.

On December 25, 2021, the James Webb Space Telescope launched from a spaceport in French Guiana aboard an Ariane 5 launch vehicle. It took about a month for the telescope to reach its

designated orbit over Earth. Since then, James Webb has taken several stunning images of our universe. It has also recorded data on an exoplanet.

Its first image was revealed on July 11th, 2022, by President Joe Biden, while others were revealed later. One of these images is of interacting galaxies called “Stephens Quintet.” The image showcases a spectacular display of colliding galaxies. Gasses and dust are seen being flung off due to gravitational forces. Not only that, the photo is huge! It is constructed of 150 million pixels and nearly 1,000 image files.

Another image is of NGC 3324, a cluster of newborn stars in the Carina Nebula. The image consists of stars in what appears to be colorful and transparent mountains and valleys. In reality, it is just gasses left by a supernova.

Other than taking images, James Webb is able to perform analysis on the atmospheres of very distant exoplanets. One example of such analysis was conducted on a distant gas giant known as WASP-96 B. James Webb was able to identify water molecules in the planet’s atmosphere by looking at very small decreases in light coming from it.

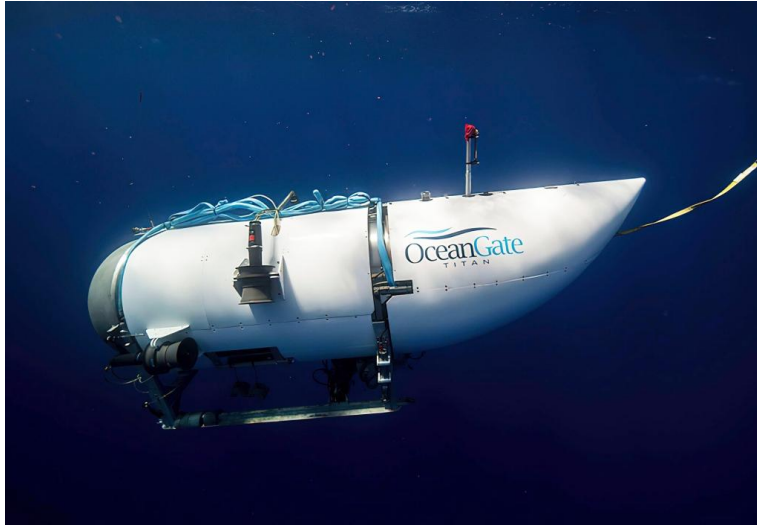
In conclusion, the James Webb Space Telescope has already produced stunning results from its pictures. It is clearly set to continue its work and further propel our knowledge of the universe.

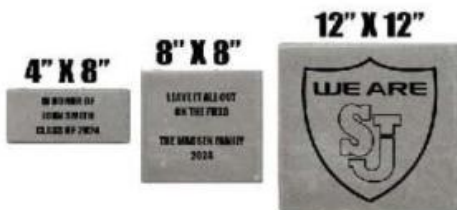
